Why did the Holy Spirit lead Paul to write a theological masterpiece...the Book of Romans? This book is the first systematic theology of the Christian faith (Swindoll). God's people needed encouragement. Paul's letter (1) helped them understand the gospel and clarified what may have been confusing, (2) affirmed their faith in Jesus and their personal obedience, and (3) cast vision for the future and encouraged them to join Paul in his gospel ministry.

Paul's personal encounter (salvation) with the risen Lord changed, transformed his life. He went from a rebellious sinner to a radical saint. Paul saw himself as a servant of Jesus Christ. What a great title!
